



**MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD AT
THE HENBURY COMMUNITY CENTRE
MONDAY 11th November 2019**

- 1. Attending:** Mike Murch, Alan Piper, Deana Perry, Pearl Semple, Pat and Ray Thomas, Ian Smith, Julia Gilvear, Janet Smith, Bev Murray, John and Liam Butler, Helen Windsor, Gloria Walsh-Gill, Susan Palmer, Paul Lennon, Alan Aburrow, Sue Potter and Ron Owen.
- 2. Apologies** were received from: Anthea Mustard, Sam Masson, Tony Whitelaw, Rose Carr, Helen Godwin, Brenda Massey and Christine Portch.
- 3. Minutes of the October meeting:** were signed by Alan Piper.
- 4. Henbury and Brentry Community Update:** Mark reported that the sewer work was progressing with clearance of the site next to the Ford continuing. The recent heavy rain was causing problems with the Ford not helped by the autumn leaves and debris blocking the culvert and screen. Aldi had also started their store expansion which see an additional 17 parking spaces and more tree planting. The No. 76 Bus petition had been handed in and he would meeting with First bus officials shortly. He also raised the question of missing litter bins in various places and asked for any further siting's of "missing" bins to be reported to him. bus stop upgrades continue in the area. The clean Air zone to be introduced by the Council will have implications for everyone with diesel vehicles. Janet raised a problem of the sewer contactors Van parking.
- 5. Team Southmead Update:** Deana reported the Inclusion Southmead meetings are being held at the Lanercost Centre, which is much more suitable, with a café as well. The Manager of McColl's attends these meetings and the have appointed an independent assessor who will report on the access problem. The entrances to Doncaster Park are being changed to allow access to disabled and young Mum`s with prams or buggies. Should this change result in a return of anti social behaviour then in conjunction with the police and Parks department temporary barriers can be installed. A "Friends of Southmead Library" group has been set up with possible funding being available. A public meeting is being held at St. Stephens Church to discuss the continual problem of rubbish in and around the Arnside Shops.
- 6. Arnside and Glencoyne Square Regeneration update:** Mike reported that the deadline for public comment on the application had now closed. The Contractor had recently completed a "ground sampling" exercise and the resultant eight plots had now

been planted with bulbs and Polyanthus, which when building starts would be “harvested” for community use.

- 7. Dunmail update:-** Mike said that Lanercost Road had now reopened but the top end of Dunmail Road was closed for sewer connections.
- 8. Financial:** Helen said there had been no change in the account balance, she also confirmed that both venues had been booked for next year.
- 9. Planning Applications:** The latest monthly lists for both Wards had been circulated, Mike drew attention to a notification from South Glouc Planning for “up top 29 dwellings and associated works on land to the east of Cedar Lodge” Ref.No. PT19/15643/O. This Application in the name of Bae, which is on the same triangle of land that Redrow applied to build 32 dwellings 2 years ago.
- 10. Any other Business:** The question of the future of No Name Road was raised, we are unable to answer at this time. Sue asked if there was any information about the former Wayfarer site, Mike said that despite repeated requests for further information none was forthcoming.

There being no other business Alan thanked everyone for attending and closed the meeting at 7.10p.m.
